Equality Information and Objectives 2022 to 2026

In accordance with The Equality Act 2010 and The Equality Act 2010 (Specific Duties) Regulations 2011, we herewith detail our Equality Objectives as agreed with the Governing Body.

1. Through curriculum opportunities and wider school life, the school will promote positive attitudes to difference and good relationships between all people. We will teach and model respect of ourselves, others and our community in the hope that children and parents are tolerant and respectful of everyone's beliefs and life choices.
2. The school will strive to ensure that children from all groups and backgrounds continue to make progress at least in line with their peers to meet or exceed national expectations in English and Mathematics.
3. The school will have a culture of value and respect of all which will allow children to feel they are supported and able to make their own life choices which are informed and theirs.
4. Our focus on SEALs and our RHE will help us to teach these important areas and tolerances at age appropriate stages of their lives.

How are we meeting these aims?

1. Website updated to include equality objectives for 2022-2026
2. School identified the need to study more varied religious festivals. Whole school studies and displays of different festivals were focussed on and included in our scheme of work. Displays evidence this.
3. Diversity themed area in library Sept 2022.
4. Science displays and other topic displays to include a range of people from different backgrounds and genders.
5. All Different, All Equal whole school topic is a key driver for celebrating the range of experiences and families we live in and to foster respect in our community.
6. School visitors are planned to include a range of people to support our curriculum and core beliefs around understanding, tolerance and respect. Examples are: Hannah Cockcroft – Paralympic gold medal winner, parents and staff to discuss their religious beliefs and practices, Volunteer and stroke survivor, STEM workers to inspire our pupils and evidence positive attitudes to all groups.
