Why are children being screened?

Aim of the check is to ensure that all children are on track to read confidently and fluently end of year 2.

This is a midpoint check to ensure we have a clear understanding of what children need in year 2.

Any child who doesn't pass will continue to have phonics lessons and will retake the test in year 2.










What is Phonics?

Phonics teaches children the sounds they need to know to blend them together to read or segment them to spell.









#### **Jolly Phonics**

Systematic teaching of phonics
Teaching is multi-sensory and active with fun actions stories and songs

#### Phonics in Stanley Grove Academy

- Jolly phonics
- Starts on entry to school
- Decodable reading books to lag behind the teaching
- Phonics every day in ability groups
- Includes reading, writing, letter formation, spelling.
- Desks, correct pencil grip
- Weekly staff training sessions
- 1:1 keep up.






## Applying to reading – sounding out words

Used so that children can apply the phonics they know. They should be able to read the books sent home.


Children need to feel like readers and successful








# The Matthew effect

Reading for enjoyment at home – age appropriate library books.

- Make it part of bedtime routine
- Don't stop to ask lots of questions but clarify a word quickly if unsure
- Look at our recommended reading books see classroom doors and windows
- Use the websites we promote for age appropriate books for reading at home
- Use the local library





#### **Supporting Phonics and Reading**

- Reading favourite books over and over again
- Singing nursery rhymes and reading traditional stories
- Playing listening games
- Memory games
- Looking out for rhyming words or interesting words
- Rephrasing children's sentences or introducing a new word.
