<u>Characteristic of</u> <u>Effective learning:</u>

Play and Explore: (PE)

Guide their own thinking and actions by talking to themselves while playing. For example, a child doing a jigsaw might whisper under their breath: "Where does th' at one go? -I need to find the big horse next."

Make independent choices.

Do things independently that they have been previously taught.

Bring their own interests and fascinations into early years settings.

This helps them to develop their learning.

Respond to new experiences that you bring to their attention.

Characteristic of Effective learning:

Active learning: (AL)

Use a range of strategies to reach a goal they have set themselves.

Begin to correct their mistakes themselves. For example, instead of using increasing force to push a puzzle piece into the slot, they try another piece to see if it will fit.

Keep on trying when things are difficult.

<u>Characteristic of</u> <u>Effective learning:</u>

Creating and Thinking critically: (CT)

Take part in simple pretend play. For example, they might use an object like a brush to pretend to brush their hair, or 'drink' from a pretend cup.

Sort materials. For example, at tidyup time, children know how to put different construction materials in separate baskets.

Concentrate on achieving something that's important to them. They are increasingly able to control their attention and ignore distractions.

Things I will learn during this topic:

To launch our topic, we will be reading 'A super hero is in your book' (Tom Fletcher).

The definition of a hero is a person who is brave, helps others, and is often looked up to by others.

We will be discussing who we think are the superheroes in our lives. This could be a mum, uncle, grandma, neighbour- anyone who you look up to and who inspires you. We will also be looking at the qualities of a superhero and identifying them in ourselves!

As the seasons change, we will also be learning about Autumn and how it effects nature.


Places I will visit, people that will help me learn and exciting things that will happen:


- We will be able to dress up for the day as our favourite superhero. This could be a real superhero or someone they look up, such as a family member. Date TBC.

- We will always use game, songs and rhymes as part of our everyday learning so make our time at nursery lots of fun!




