

#### **EARLY YEARS NEWS**






Our children in Early Years continue to impress me every day. Here are some of our children caught reading together in provision. So lovely to see.

I was very impressed with **Year 1** who have been doing a topic on animals. They did some fantastic homework which showed how much they had found out. Well done, everyone.




