We have come to the end of a very busy half term and we are very proud of what has been accomplished.

Our Year 6 pupils have worked incredibly hard during SATs week and throughout the year. I would like to say a big thank you to the staff who gave up their time after school to deliver booster sessions; this shows the dedication for all staff to want to continue to support the children during their time at Stanley Grove. Our governors also wanted me to express their thanks to the staff and to say a big well done to the children.

Next term, our year 1 children will be doing their phonic screen test and year 4 will be doing their multiplication test. I know they have been putting in lots of effort with their lessons so good luck to these pupils too.

Mrs Swinburne, our Trust lead visited the academy and she was impressed with the children and the work they are producing. The children were excited to see her and it was lovely to be able to share the hard work of pupils and staff.

Children who are lower than 90% are classed as persistently absent from school and are monitored by school and our education welfare officer every week.
