Things I will learn during this topic:

- I will learn about chronology and use historical vocabulary to describe the period studied and create timeline of events.
- I will learn when and where the Vikings came from and why they raided Britain.
- I will use maps to locate where they travelled from and where they raided and settled.
- I will compare the significance of Anglo-Saxon kings during the Viking period.
- I will learn why Danegeld was introduced.
- I will learn about key aspects of Viking life, including, for example, food, clothes, religion, longboats and houses.
- I will learn about how the legal system worked in Anglo-Saxon Britain (laws and justice).
- I will look at the beliefs of people at the time.
- I will try to empathise with people who lived throughout this time period and understand what life would have been like then compared to now.
- I will use a variety of historical sources to find out about this time period including conducting research using various websites.
- I will use my research about the Viking time period to write information reports in English.
- I will read Arthur and the Golden Rope by Joe Todd-Stanton and also Vikings in 30 seconds
 use this to inspire my own writing. I will begin to learn about Norse mythology / Viking
 Sagas.
- I will weave a Viking pouch.

Places I will visit, people that will help me learn and exciting things that will happen:

- I will be visited by the Wakefield Museum and enjoy a workshop where I look at Viking artefacts. (24.04.25)
- I will visit Jorvik and The Dig to learn about Viking settlers in York. (TBC)

Key figures I will learn about:

King Alfred the Great



King Alfred is credited with being the first Anglo-Saxon king to defeat the Vikings in battle and buy the people of Britain some peace from them. Alfred became king in AD 871. He reigned until his death in AD 899.

King Athelstan (King Alfred's grandson)



After the death of King Alfred the Great, his son - Edward the Elder - took the throne. When Edward died, his son Athelstan (King Alfred's grandson) became king. Athelstan is regarded as the first king of all Britain and he is remembered as a great leader. Athelstan was king from AD 924-939. During his reign, he drove the Vikings back more and more and was able to claim control over a greater area of land. In AD 927, Athelstan won back the kingdom of York from the Vikings.
